

FIFE PILGRIM WAY

The 64-mile Fife Pilgrim Way starts at Culross or North Queensferry, meeting in **Dunfermline** before winding through the lesser-known Fife areas, passing medieval landmarks, industrial landscapes, and picturesque villages en route to **St Andrews**. The route features easy sections for short walks or longer challenges. Walkers in Levenmouth can connect with the route in Windygates.

cycling or walking to the East Neuk of


Fife. A short walk from Leven station


is Fife Heritage Railway. Visit to take

a ride on one of their vintage trains.



FIFE COASTAL PATH

The Fife Coastal Path is a 117-mile route that follows the coastline of Fife from Kincardine to Newburgh. The sections of the Fife Coastal Path in Levenmouth take in areas of mining and industrial heritage, urban areas, stunning beaches, quaint villages, and historic buildings. Look for gannets, seals or the occasional pod of dolphins too!
