

# Located in Central Scotland



Fife is centrally located in East Scotland and is easily accessible from all major cities in Scotland



## By Rail

Fife is efficiently connected to the broader Scottish rail network via the East Coast Main line and Fife Circle Line. This rail service offers regular and direct train connections to key cities such as Edinburgh and Aberdeen, and national connection to London. The Fife Circle Line provides residents and visitors with a convenient and accessible means of travel, facilitating efficient transportation within the region.



## By Air

Fife is perfectly located for travelers, just 20 minutes from Edinburgh Airport and under an hour from Glasgow Airport. With its international connectivity and excellent transport links, it's the ideal gateway to Scotland's stunning coastline, charming, city, towns, and rich heritage.




## By Car & Coach

To reach Fife by car or coach from Edinburgh and Glasgow:

- From Edinburgh: Travel north via the M90 motorway, crossing the iconic Queensferry Crossing into Fife. The journey takes about 30 minutes to reach the West of Fife and around an hour and a half to reach North Fife and St Andrews
- From Glasgow: Take the M8 eastbound towards Edinburgh, then the M90 north via the Queensferry Crossing into Fife, or via the Kincardine Bridge to Dunfermline and West Fife.

These well-maintained routes offer quick and scenic access to Fife and are suitable for coach travel.

By rail – 1 hours 40 minutes

To Aberdeen:
