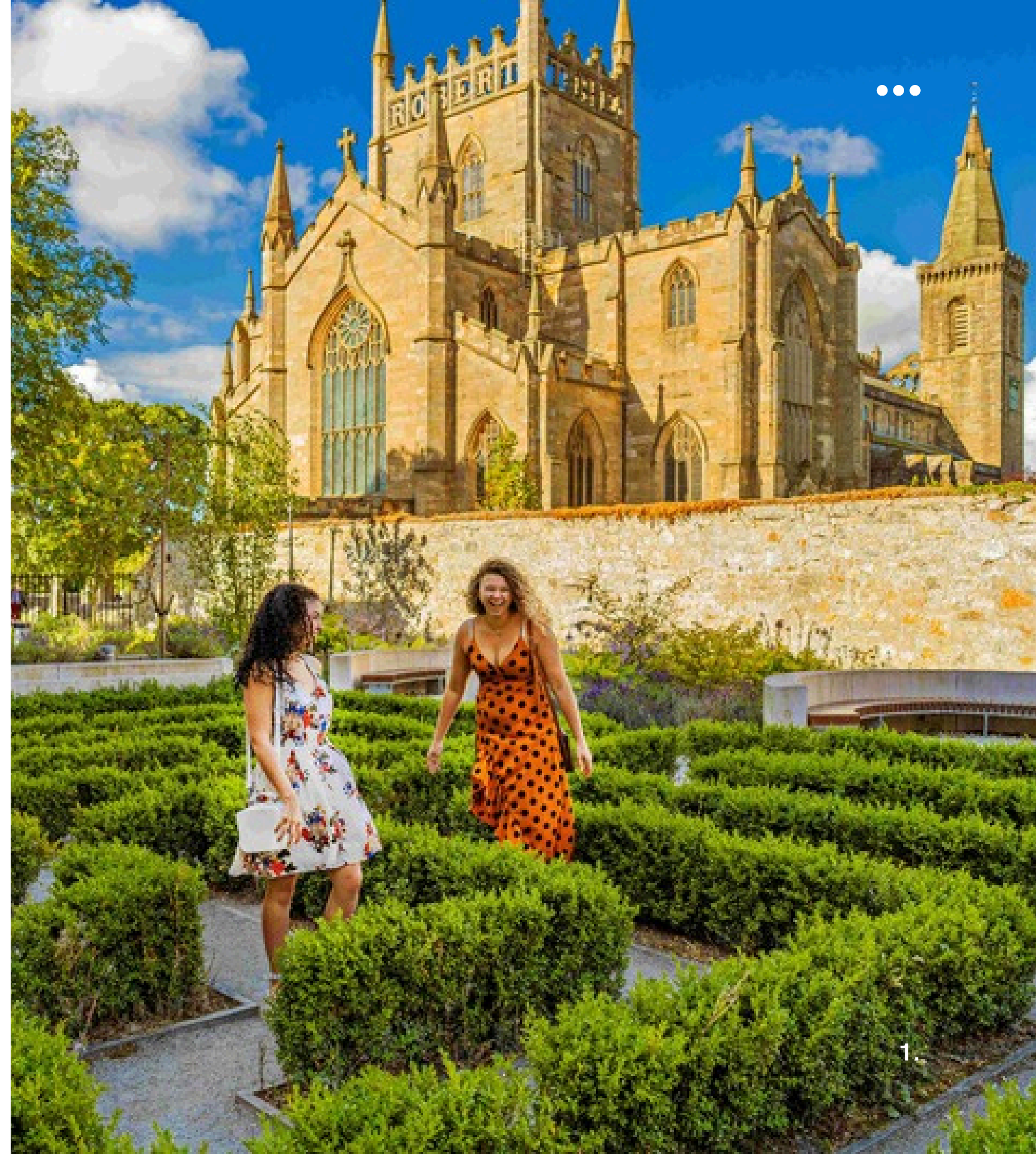




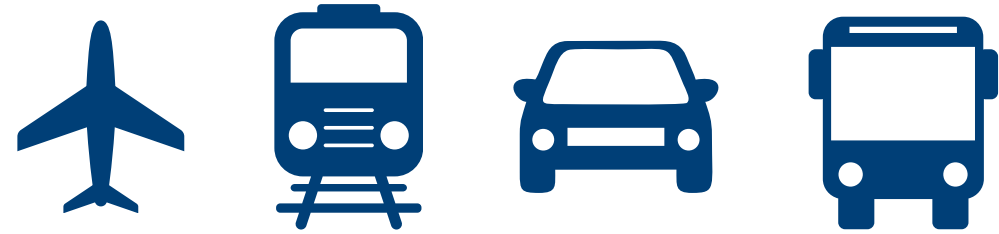

# Located in Central Scotland



Fife is centrally located in East Scotland and is easily accessible from all major cities in Scotland



Fife is efficiently connected to the broader Scottish rail network via the East Coast Main line and Fife Circle Line. This rail service offers regular and direct train connections to key cities such as Edinburgh and Aberdeen, and national connection to London. The Fife Circle Line provides residents and visitors with a convenient and accessible means of travel, facilitating efficient transportation within the region.



Fife is perfectly located for travelers, just 20 minutes from Edinburgh Airport and under an hour from Glasgow Airport. With its international connectivity and excellent transport links, it's the ideal gateway to Scotland's stunning coastline, charming, city, towns, and rich heritage.



To reach Fife by car or coach from Edinburgh and Glasgow:

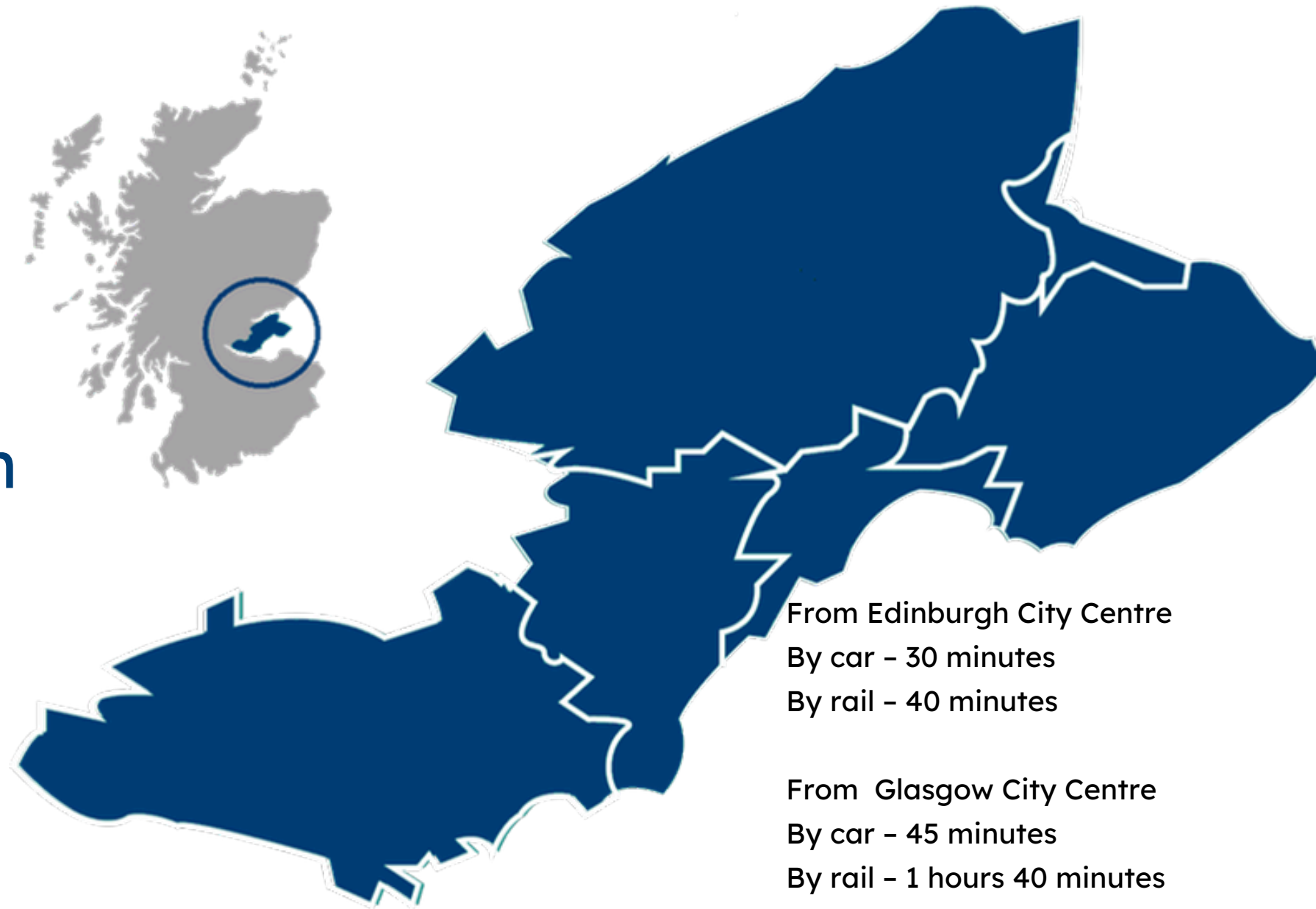
- From Edinburgh: Travel north via the M90 motorway, crossing the iconic Queensferry Crossing into Fife. The journey takes about 30 minutes to reach the West of Fife and around an hour and a half to reach North Fife and St Andrews
- From Glasgow: Take the M8 eastbound towards Edinburgh, then the M90 north via the Queensferry Crossing into Fife, or via the Kincardine Bridge to Dunfermline and West Fife.

These well-maintained routes offer quick and scenic access to Fife and are suitable for coach travel.

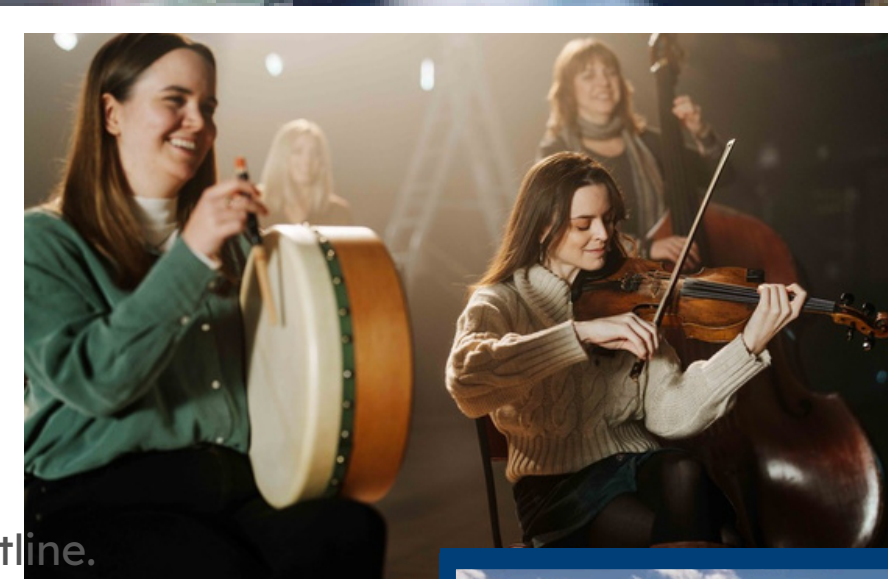

## Andrew Carnegie Birthplace Museum

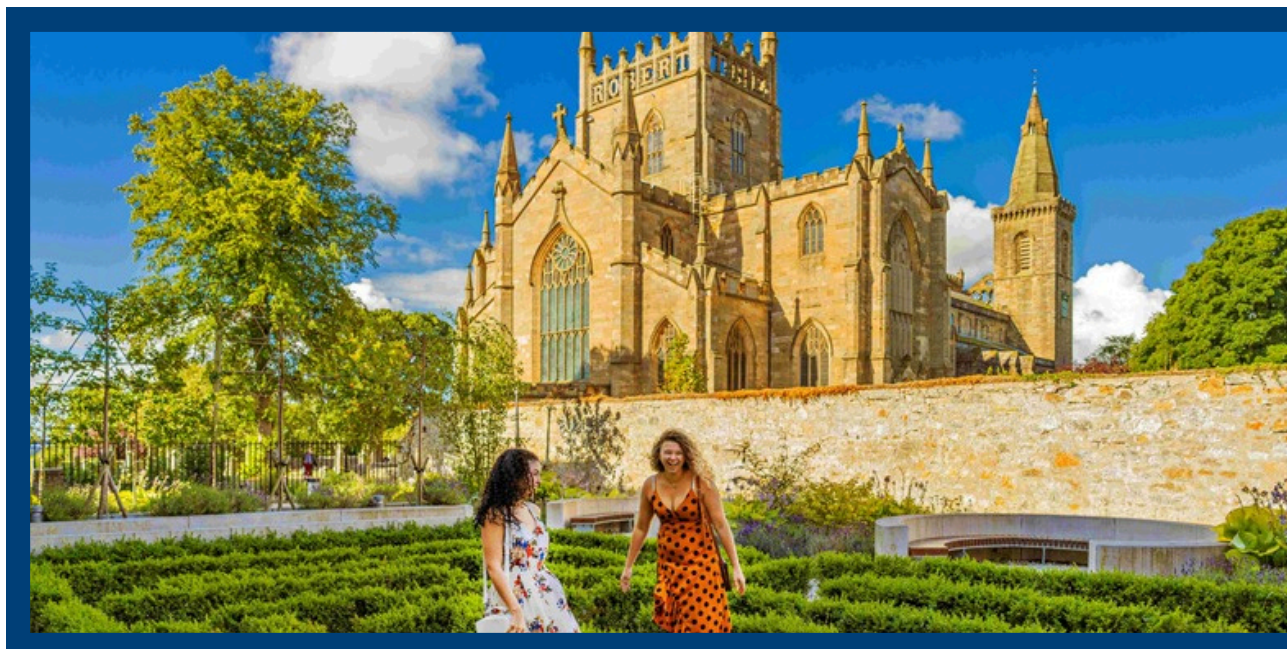
Philanthropist, steel tycoon, writer, lecturer, entrepreneur - Andrew Carnegie was one of the great Scots of the 19th century. Carnegie left a legacy which continues today, as his birthplace cottage testifies he came from humble beginnings. Adjacent to the cottage is the Art Deco style museum hall, built by his widow Louise Carnegie in 1928. Explore the cottage and follow the family's journey to America where he made his fortune. Discover why he became known as the father of philanthropy.

## Dunfermline Abbey & Palace

Explore Scotland's most complete Romanesque church and its only surviving royal guest house. Dunfermline Abbey, founded as a priory by Queen Margaret and later expanded by her son in 1128, became a royal mausoleum. It is the final resting place of King Robert Bruce (minus his heart) and seven other Scottish kings. The abbey complex includes a vast 12th-century nave and the ruins of a 16th-century palace built by James VI, birthplace of Charles I. Though royal interest faded, the remains still offer a fascinating glimpse into Scotland's history.

## Abbot House

Abbot House, Dunfermline's oldest house, sits in the Heritage Quarter with views of Dunfermline Abbey. Known as the "pink house," it's over 500 years old. The house features a gift and book shop with local artisan products, Prost Coffee, artisan studios, and event rooms. Its 17th-century herb garden, planted with quince, lavender, sage, and rosemary, adds to its charm. A Visitor Centre to tell the house's story is planned for 2025. The garden was recreated by The Beechgrove Garden in 1995, reflecting the formal 17th-century style.

## Royal Burgh of Culross

## Culross Palace

Explore Culross Palace, featuring original painted panels, atmospheric sounds, and three terraced gardens. Step back in time with beautifully restored 17th- and 18th-century interiors, including painted woodwork. The village's white-harled houses with red-tiled roofs line cobbled streets leading to the hilltop abbey. The ochre-coloured palace has a reconstructed period garden with herbs, fruits, and rare Scots Dumpy hens. Due to its historic structure, only 8 visitors can enter every 15 minutes. Highlights include one of Scotland's most picturesque villages, Outlander filming locations, and the charming palace with tiny rooms and painted ceilings.

## Broomhall House

Broomhall House, the historic home of the Bruce family and the Earls of Elgin, offers exclusive private tours. Guests explore the library with over 4,000 books, a picture gallery with old master paintings, a museum of curiosities, and a dining room with 16th-century Dutch furniture. Tours, led by Lord Bruce, showcase British historical artifacts, including the 14th-century sword of King Robert the Bruce, letters from Queen Victoria, and diplomatic gifts. Lunch or dinner can be included, making it a unique and memorable experience.

## Aberdour Castle

Aberdour Castle was built in the 1100s and went on to serve generations of three noble families – including a Regent of Scotland. It was once the luxurious Renaissance home and gardens of Regent Morton, in his heyday, Scotland’s most powerful man. Built by the Douglas family, the 13th century fortified residence was extended in the 15th, 16th and 17th centuries, See the large and imposing suite of buildings from the 12th to the 17th century with the grand hall-house, thought to be the oldest standing stone castle in Scotland. There is also a delightful walled garden, with scented flowers and a beehive-shaped doocot, which overlooks the Forth.

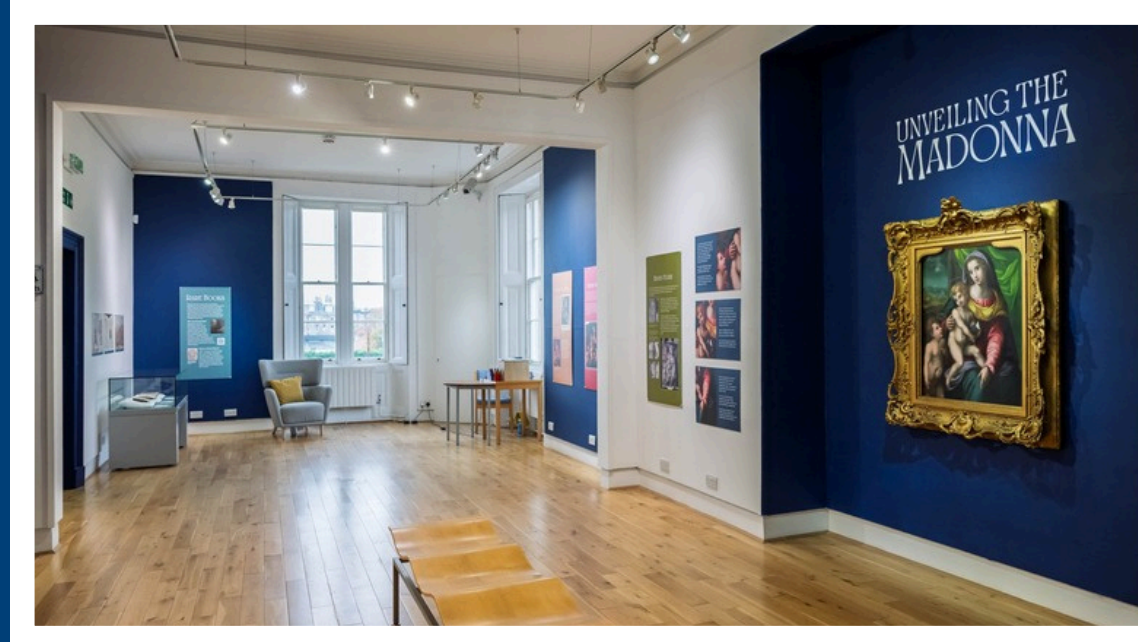
## Dunfermline Carnegie, Library and Galleries
