

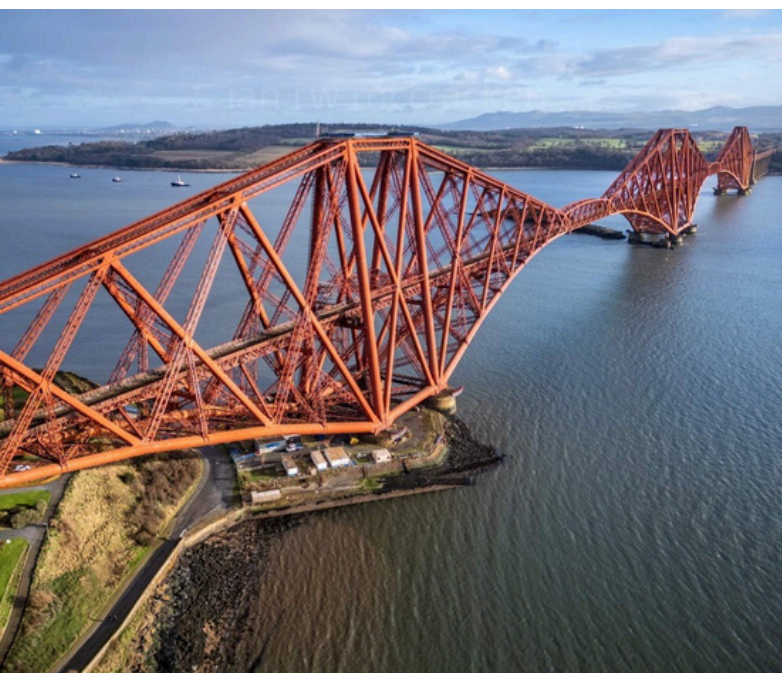

Pre Night: Arrival at North Queensferry

Guests arrive in North Queensferry, a picturesque village set beneath the iconic Forth Bridges. An overnight stay at the DoubleTree by Hilton Edinburgh – North Queensferry provides a comfortable and well-connected base, with views across the Firth of Forth setting the tone for the days ahead.

Day 1: Coastal Walking & Scottish Heritage

The journey begins with a short transfer to the historic village of Culross, one of Scotland's best-preserved 17th-century settlements. Guests can explore cobbled streets, Culross Palace and the abbey before heading west along the Fife Coastal Path towards Limekilns, where restored harbours reflect the area's industrial past. A stop at Coorie by the Coast offers a welcoming break before continuing along the coastline to North Queensferry, where dramatic views of the Forth Bridges create a memorable arrival back at the Double Tree. In the evening, guests enjoy a standout dining experience at The Wee Restaurant, showcasing seasonal Scottish produce.

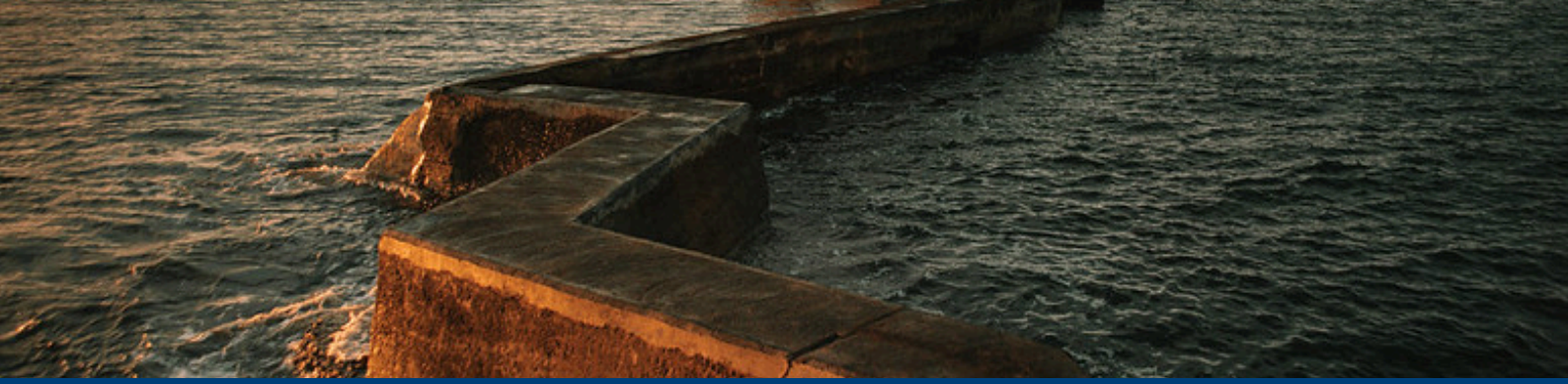
Day 2: Coastal Rail Journey

Day two offers a relaxed exploration of the Fife coast via one of Scotland's most scenic rail routes. Travelling east from North Queensferry, guests can hop between coastal towns including Aberdour, Burntisland and Kirkcaldy. In Aberdour, clients can visit one of Scotland's oldest stone castles set within attractive grounds, while Burntisland provides a lively seaside atmosphere, particularly during the summer months when its traditional fair brings colour and character to the beachfront. For those seeking a more memorable experience, an optional Forth Sea Safari offers the chance to explore the coastline by boat, spotting wildlife and taking in views from the water. The day continues to Kirkcaldy for a visit to the Galleries, before travelling onward to Leven and Lundin Links, where guests stay overnight at the Old Manor Hotel, overlooking the coast.

Day 3: East Neuk Coastal Walk

Beginning at Lundin Links, guests are guided through the heart of the East Neuk—a collection of traditional fishing villages known for their distinctive harbours, rich heritage, and warm, welcoming communities. The route passes through Elie and on to St Monans, offering gentle walking with expansive coastal views throughout. Lunch at the renowned Ship Inn provides a highlight, with fresh seafood served alongside beautiful coastal views. In the afternoon, the journey continues to Anstruther, where guests can visit the Scottish Fisheries Museum and gain insight into the area's deep maritime roots. Along the way, there is also the opportunity to take part in a unique seaweed foraging experience with East Neuk Seaweed, offering a hands-on introduction to the coastline's natural larder. Nearby Cellardyke adds a memorable wellness element, with wild swimming and a coastal sauna set against the backdrop of the harbour. The day concludes in Crail, where guests stay at The Shoregate and enjoy a high-quality dining experience.

Day 4: Crail, Kingbarns & St Andrews

A slower-paced morning in Crail includes a guided walk and visit to the Heritage Museum, offering insight into the village's history and maritime culture, followed by a relaxed and highly photogenic stop at the Harbour Café. From here, guests continue to Kingsbarns Distillery—either by walking, private transfer, or via the scenic 95 coastal bus route—where they can enjoy a tour and tasting, connecting Fife's agricultural roots with its growing reputation for craft whisky and gin production. A visit to Cambo Estate adds a further dimension, with opportunities to explore gardens, woodland and local produce, before arriving in St Andrews, one of Scotland's most iconic destinations. Staying overnight at the newly opened Kithmore Hotel which is perfectly situated to allow clients to explore the town, beaches and historic sites at their own pace. Dinner recommendations; HAAR, The Adamson, and The Seafood Ristorante.





Day 5: St Andrews, Food & Drink Finale & Flexible Departure

Your final day begins in St Andrews, where visitors can take part in a guided cycle tour with Stewart's Bicycle Tours, offering a relaxed and engaging way to explore the town's key highlights, including the historic university, cathedral ruins, harbour and world-famous Old Course. This is followed by a visit to Eden Mill Distillery for a gin and whisky tasting. From here, clients can transfer to Leuchars Station for direct rail connections to Edinburgh or Dundee, or extend their stay with visits to Tayport and Tentsmuir Forest, where pine woodland and expansive beaches offer a tranquil coastal setting of woodland, dunes and open beach. The journey can also include a stop at Newburgh Handloom Weavers, with the option to finish at The Hide at Lindores, offering a unique and memorable setting to enjoy a final drink or relaxed experience to close the trip.
